# Welcome to our Impact Report 2024/25!

We're delighted to be able to share this overview of the impact that **Sunderland Students' Union** has made in the past academic year.

As a team of Presidents, we're proud to have been at the forefront of these efforts and achievements, working alongside incredible SU staff, Trustees, SU Crew, student reps, society committee members, volunteers and so many more!

Before we get into a snapshot of our impact as an organisation in the pages that follow, we'd like to briefly share some personal highlights.





## President: Activities Prince Ikechi

The past year has been impressively remarkable with some impactful changes in my campaigns.

- ★ Cost of Living Increased awareness and accessibility on cost-of-living (Hub) support services at the University. Ensuring the University's commitment to Agent Quality Framework (AQF) in tackling agent integrity and enhancing the experience of international students.
- ★ Transportation Campaigned locally and nationally for student friendly travel policies to include discounted fares, improved public transport, affordability and accessibility for students within the NE region.
- ★ Housing Advocated and supported national efforts for reforms within the Renters' Rights Bill. Also worked closely with Sunderland city council (Smart City) and the University for a development of a residential strategy to locally support student accommodation within the city.

#### One Highlight:

Good feedback from students and positive acknowledgement from the University on the implemented payment plan with a substantial reduction in debt related to student tuition fees.

#### One Challenge:

Reviewing the delays in how the University's finance team handles student-related issues, with the aim of streamlining processes and improving response times.





## President: Education Dola Dada

The past year has allowed me to explore my campaigns more thoroughly and initiate meaningful changes.

I've remained focused on enhancing student academic integrity and success by pursuing three key priorities.


- ★ Introduce a Student Consultation Framework
  to ensure that student input is fed into all university
  decision making e.g. impacts to the student
  experience through faculty mergers and
  course closures.
- ★ Standardise and improve the use of the module feedback form, working with the University to achieve this.
- ★ Improving PGT employability by increasing opportunities for industry experience, placements, and sector skill-sharing.

#### One Highlight:

The ongoing work with the university on the Student Consultation Framework and the improved consultation and communication between students and the University so far.

#### One Challenge:

Ensuring adequate representation of our diverse and ever-changing student body. It's often difficult to make decisions that reflect the varied and evolving needs of all students.







## President: London Felicia Udofia

It was a busy start to the year, and I packed a lot in before moving on to a new role working for Transport for London in January.

- ★ Extenuating Circumstances policy ensuring it was appropriate for London students and reduce waiting times on hearing back on Academic Misconduct Panels. The quality enhancement team reviewed and updated the EC policy, introducing possible resubmission and assessment boards dates.
- ★ The Careers and Employability Team working with them at the University of Sunderland in London to ensure that, where possible, there was opportunities for the university to engage with and create partnerships with local businesses to aid in students gaining work experience and graduate jobs.
- ★ Celebrations for Student Volunteers have been working with the Students' Union to ensure that there are future opportunities to celebrate and recognise the hard work of our student volunteers.

#### One Highlight:

Our initiatives significantly boosted Student Engagement both in person and online, seeing hundreds more students attend our events and follow our socials!

#### One Challenge:

Timetabling and Inductions, always trying to make sure that as many students from as many different courses can attend and take in what the Students' Union has to offer as possible.







### President: Wellbeing Babatunde Jimoh

This year, I've focussed on enhancing student wellbeing by encouraging student engagement through wellbeing activities.

- ★ Charity Football Tournament: Organised a tournament featuring 10 mixed teams of students, staff and charity representatives to promote both physical and mental wellbeing through friendly competition and community engagement.
- ★ Mental Health First Aid Training: Successfully organised a two and a half day training session for 12 students, including another SU president.
- ★ Someone to Talk Too: Planning is underway to establish a student focus group aimed at exploring their understanding of the University's wellbeing services and identifying ways to improve student awareness and engagement.
- ★ Student Maintenance Loan Payment Campaign: Actively advocating nationally for a shift from termly to monthly maintenance loan payments.

#### One Highlight:

One of my biggest highlights was successfully organising and executing the Charity Cup Football Tournament at the Beacon of Light.

#### One Challenge:

A key challenge I've encountered with the Student Maintenance Loan campaign is managing expectations around the pace of change. Balancing long-term policy change with short-term student needs have proven to be a complex but important part of this campaign.









Sunderland Students' Union Advice Service has provided invaluable support across Sunderland and London campuses throughout 2024/25.

Our free, confidential and independent advice primarily focuses on academic issues (such as academic misconduct, appeals, complaints, fitness to practise and progression issues), but Advisors have also been able to refer students to the right University services for other support, e.g. wellbeing.

Students who provided feedback on the Advice Service overwhelmingly agreed that the team was extremely helpful and supportive, would recommend the service to a friend and were satisfied with their experience with the Service.

#### Student Feedback 1:

I just want to take a moment to sincerely thank you. Your support, guidance, and reassurance made such a difficult process feel a little more manageable. Knowing that someone was in my corner truly meant a lot and I will always be grateful for that.

#### Student Feedback 2:

I am deeply grateful for your instrumental role in resolving my academic misconduct case. Your swift response and willingness to listen to my concerns greatly alleviated my anxiety/fear. Your expert guidance throughout the appeals process was priceless, and I appreciate how you advocated for me.

#### **Student Voices** at OfS Board Meeting

Sunderland's Student Voice Reps Kai Longstaff and Laura Merrison joined a panel of six student reps at the latest Office for Students Board Meeting. They shared experiences with Director for Fair Access and Participation. John Blake, highlighting challenges faced by students entering higher education through non-traditional routes. Key topics included university choice, assessments, work-life balance, and educational innovation.

#### BA (Hons) Community and Youth Course Reinstated

When the University indefinitely paused the traditional BA (Hons) Community and Youth Work course, I, along with fellow students and course reps. challenged the decision due to rising demand for youth workers and government support. I met with senior University staff and NYA CEO, and authored a letter to the Dean-signed by over 100 students, alumni, and professionals-outlining concerns and financial solutions. As a result. the University agreed to reopen recruitment for the course in September 2026.












## Getting Involved: Student Views...

This trip was made possible through the determination and community organising of our students.



## **Community**Organising

#### **Free Period Products**

After the University undertook a financial review, we were informed that it could no longer support the provision of free period products on campus.

As the initial campaign
- launched by the outgoing
President: Wellbeing - was nearing
the end of their term, we shifted
our focus toward a community
organising strategy to ensure
its continuation.

We mobilised key student groups, including FemSoc and the LGBTQ+ Society, who in turn activated their networks, bringing in other student-led groups like the Cosy Corner Society.

Together, they coordinated efforts and shared powerful personal testimonies in letters to the Vice-Chancellor, outlining why continuing the free provision would be a point of pride for the University.

At the same time, our Students' Union CEO engaged with Alumni to explore sustainable funding models for the initiative.

Thanks to the collective pressure and collaboration of our student community, we secured a renewed supply of free period products.


